Contest Regulations:

- The student must do all the work themselves.
- Only one entry per student; no group entries.
- Limit ONE Entry Per Grade Level Per School.
- The main medium should be non-perishable, recycled materials. Materials can include but are not limited to the following: bottle caps, zip ties, styrofoam, plastic bags, aluminum cans, etc.
- All pieces must be secured to a matted poster.
 You may use adhesives such as glue, staples,
 tape, etc. to hold pieces together.
- Any additional media including felt tip markers, crayons, watercolor, or acrylics may be used.

- No sharp edges.
- Minimum poster size: 10" x 12"
- Maximum poster size: 24" x 24"
- Each entry must be matted with a completed label (see below) attached firmly to the lower right FRONT corner of the matted poster.
