Spring Break is here and both our students and staff were all ready for a well deserved vacation. We hope that over these next few days you will take some time to enjoy your children and families. Even though we always encourage you to have your children stay connected to their academics, it is also important for them to take a break and rejuvenate. This week comes at a much needed time on purpose and when we return it is a long haul to the finish line. If you do celebrate, please enjoy your Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

This past week we were able to celebrate all of the students for their hard work on I-Ready. Kona Ice came out and served each student an icee and the kids loved getting to choose their flavors. It was a special treat for the students and staff. I-Ready will still be an expectation for the students throughout the remainder of the year, so continue to encourage this at home for about 10 minutes per day if you have access to a computer or internet. This is very closely aligned to our FAST Assessment.

Staying along the lines of Kona Ice, we are going to start offering this to students over the next few months. This will not be free but a pre-paid system where parents will be able to pay ahead and students will be able to get this treat during their lunch or recess time. We are looking at some days in April and May to have them come out and do this before the end of the year. Whether your child is a highly academic student performing well in the class or a struggling student, school is important. It's hard to believe we are now into our 4th quarter of Kindergarten! We still have lots of learning to do. We will be working on sums and differences to 20 and numbers to 100 in math. In science, we will be learning about weather, plants and life cycles. This always seems to be one of the favorites by all the children! We will be going on a field trip to Fern Forest on April 3rd and 4th. Save the dates: May 13th - 24th our kindergarteners will be going swimming at the Mullins Park pool. We will be walking across the street each day for a 30-minute swim lesson. Please make sure to send your child in their bathing suit everyday, apply sunscreen at home, send a towel and change of clothes each day. We will also need a volunteer each day to walk with us. If you have any questions, please ask your child's teacher and more information will be coming home when it gets closer. Make sure you are reading each night with your child and completing homework regularly. These skills are important to instill in a child at a young age. They will learn to love to read and feel confident within themselves! Happy Spring!

#### First Grade

Springtime is here, which means last quarter of the year! In math, we began to work with measuring objects to the nearest inch and centimeter. Have your child find objects around the house to measure! We will also be working on time and money. We will be working on time to the hour and

half hour. Counting coins and dollar bills is also an exciting skill! Practice makes perfect! During the month of April, we will learn about gravity, force, motion, day, and night. The children tend to love this science unit. We hope during this unit your children have lots to tell you! Go explore outside! We will be also talking about the sun and how it can be harmful and helpful! As we begin the last quarter of this school year, all the first-grade teachers will heavily be focused on reading and reading comprehension. We are diligently trying to prepare the children for the End of the Year Reading Test. The passages we've been completing at school and at home, is one way to practice, but please do not forget that simply reading with your child and having conversations about what they've read is just as powerful! As always, thanks for all you do to be part of your child's learning journey!

# Second Grade

We hope you all had a restful Spring Break. Second grade is ready to dive back into our curriculum. Our Language Arts unit integrates nicely with our Earth Science standards. We will be reading informational texts and opinion pieces about different Earth structures and about changes

brought about by events in Nature. In Math, we will be moving into measurement. We will be estimating and measuring using inches, feet, and yards. We will also use metric units such as centimeters and meters. On April 4th, we will have someone come and show us some authentic Native American Artifacts and talk to us about various tribes across the United States. Our topic in social studies for April is Government and Citizenship. We will explore how people become U.S. citizens. We will discuss what it means to be a good citizen. In Science, we will be exploring wind, water, and the Sun's energy. Please continue to read daily with your child and ask them comprehension questions about the book. Students can also benefit from practicing math facts. They should be fluent in basic addition and subtraction in order to help them with 2- and 3-digit addition and subtraction. Please reach out to you child's teacher if you have any questions.

Third Grade Families, It is hard to believe that the year is soon coming to a close. Our trip to Lion Country Safari was very rewarding and a lot of fun for all who attended. We are so proud of our students' growth this year. In Mathematics, we will focus on solving word problems using bar graphs, pictographs, and stem plots, and focusing on solving problems using time. In science, our focus will be the laws of gravity and objects in the sky. In Social Studies, our students will be paired with a peer to work on travel brochures, National Parks and regions; and learn about the functions of our government. Our Reading series consists of a spiral review and at this point in the year, students have been exposed to all the standards. It is essential that students read daily for at least 30 minutes per day and complete the 45 minutes of I-Ready weekly in both Math and Reading. It has been proven that good readers become good writers, and fourth grade will be doing a substantial amount of writing weekly. As we embark on the final quarter of the school year, remember that 3rd grade is a mandatory retention year. That means their scores on the upcoming assessments are paramount for promotion. Students need to be in school ON TIME every day; and be awake and attentive. Testing isn't everything, but learning is an ongoing process, and students need to be present both in body and mind and attitude every single day. Below are important dates to put on your calendars: May 14 - Reading FAST Test (promotion criteria) May 21 - Math FAST May 23 - Schoolwide Exhibition (in the evening) June 7 - 3rd Grade End-of-the-Year Assembly.

Have no fear spring break is near! Here at Parkside elementary in the marvelous month of march, our students have been working very hard on their core subjects! In math we our brains fizzled as we learned about fractions and moved on to decimals. Science was a little rocky but, our students learned about minerals and how we classify them! In reading, we are learning about myths and legends and the themes that accompany them! Lastly, with our writing tests around the corner, our students have been crafting beautiful essays as we head into the final stretch! The theme for this month? Hard work pays off!

Happy April! 5th grade has been working hard. In reading, we have been focusing on summarizing fiction texts as well as setting, events, conflict, solution, and perspective. In math, we are working on dividing whole numbers by unit fractions. In science, we are learning about environmental changes. We have been working hard writing expository and argumentative essays.
