LIGHTNING BUCKS

Lightning Bucks reward program we're launching as part of our Schoolwide Positive Behavior Plan (SPBP). Students will receive Lightning Bucks for demonstrating our core values: accountability, respect, and responsibility.

These Bucks can be exchanged for special treats during lunch. Please be ready to distribute Lightning Bucks to students when you see them exhibiting positive behaviors. This program is designed to reinforce and reward the behaviors we want to see across the school.



ALYSSA'S ALERT

Mobile Duress Alert App

Alyssa's Alert is a mobile duress alert application that empowers staff members to immediately notify first responders in the event of an emergency. Receive potentially life-saving aid with the push of a button.

Speed Crisis Response

Upon activation*, local first responders & District personnel receive an immediate notification of the emergency.

Easy to Use

Select one of the three buttons (shown right) to activate Alyssa's Alert. Assistance will immediately be dispatched to your location.**

Stay Connected

Administrators will be able to push important updates regarding an emergency situation to anyone who has downloaded Alyssa's Alert.

*Duress buttons can only be activated while physically on school property.

**ONLY first responders may access location information upon button
activation. Under no other circumstances is location information
accessible.


