

Our school district provides a program of language instruction for English Language Learners (ELLs) to attain English proficiency, and meet the same challenging academic content and student achievement standards expected of all students.

Upon enrollment, a language other than English was noted on your child's Home Language Survey. According to state and federal law, our school district is required to assess the English language proficiency of your child in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Based on the results of the CELLA, a state-approved assessment for measuring English language proficiency, we are pleased to inform you that your child is eligible for services for English Language Learners. Below, please find results that have informed our decision, information about our language programs, and your rights as a parent.

Abin took the CELLA on 3/5/2014 and their ELP assessment results are listed below:

Teachers of English Language Learners provide a variety of specialized services until students demonstrate skills in English sufficient for them to succeed academically in the regular classroom. While the rate of English language development (ELD) varies between students, many exit the ELD program in 2-6 vears.

All children, regardless of English proficiency, are eligible to participate in all school-wide programs. If your child has an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), or a 504 plan, the language instruction educational program will be utilized in coordination with your child's existing plan.


Our school district provides English language instruction within the context of academic content – using grade-level curriculum – to students at all levels of English language proficiency (ELP) by offering the following programs:

Language Level Classifications

A1

- Non-English Speaker or Minimal Knowledge of English
- Cannot communicate orally

A2

- Limited English
 Speaker
- Communicates with one or twoword responses



Language Level Classifications

B1

 Intermediate English Speaker

 Communicates mostly with simple phrases and/or sentences responses

B2

- Intermediate English Speaker
- Communicates about everyday situations but lacks the academic language

Language Level Classifications

C1

 Advanced English Speaker

 Speaks, reads, and writes at a comparable level with English-speaking counterpart

ESOL PROGRAM

All schools with students classified as ELL <u>must</u> provide an appropriate ESOL program to meet the specific needs of such students in language learning, academic achievement, and in cultural integration.



ALLOWABLE TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR ELLS

- Flexible Setting: ELLs may be tested in a different room with other ELL students. Parents MUST be informed of this option.
- Flexible Scheduling: ELLs may take a session of the test during several brief periods within one school day; however a session of the test MUST be completed within one school day.



ALLOWABLE TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR ELLS

•Flexible Timing (Additional Time): ELLs may be provided additional time; however a session MUST be completed within one school day.

•Limited Assistance in Heritage Language

 Approved Dictionary: ELLs MUST have access to an English to heritage language dictionary and/or heritage language to English dictionary (word-to-word).

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children develop awareness and management of their emotions, set and achieve important personal and academic goals, use social-awareness and interpersonal skills to establish and maintain positive relationships, and demonstrate decision making and responsible behaviors to achieve school and life success.








2015 - 2016 is a transition year

HOW DOES MY CHILD EXIT THE ESOL PROGRAM?

EXIT Criteria

There are two ways to exit the ESOL Program:

1. Student meet the Exit Criteria set forth by the State in State Statute.

2. An ELL Committee determines the student no longer needs services provided by the ESOL Program.



ELL COMMITTEE







ELL Committee

The main function of the ELL committee is to resolve any issue that affects the instructional program of an ELL.

Parents must always be invited to attend the meeting



Monitoring

Students are monitored for two years after exiting the ESOL program.

If anytime within those two years, the parent or teacher has evidence that the student is having difficulty due to language acquisition, an ELL committee is convened to determine if the student should reenter the ESOL program.

- The Parent Outreach Office was created in 2000 through a Title VII grant specifically for ELL parents and families. Since 2005 it is under Title III funds.
- We provide services to English Language Learner (ELL) parents, families, and schools to ensure they are collaborating in the development of parent involvement plans.
- We provide information, rights and responsibilities, orientation and resources to parents, students and community members to increase their involvement and assist them in making good academic decisions, regardless of their level of English proficiency.



Individual Assistance to ELLs, Parents, and Community Organizations

- Meet with families on one-to-one basis when necessary
- Attend ELL Committee Meetings with parents when requested
- Secure registration at schools regardless of arrival times and immigrant status
- Provide orientation for completing District and School forms
- Other Issues:
 - Discipline
 - Placement
 - Process for ESE
 - Graduation requirements/Course selection
 - Transportation
 - Chain of command

ESOL Parent Ambassadors Program

The ESOL Parent Ambassador Program:

- Was established as an initiative of the ESOL Leadership Council.
- Created to assist non-English speaking families, especially the newly arrived, with the transition to Broward County Public
 Schools in order to be connected, comfortable and confident with the education their children are receiving.





PARENT LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- The Parent Outreach Office offers Parent Leadership training, as required by the META Consent Decree, to empower the parents to be active leaders in the ESOL Leadership Council, promote ELL issues, collaborate with the Bilingual/ESOL Department, within the community and with other district committees. The trainings are conducted twice a year.
- Since the creation of the ESOL Parent Ambassadors, our office also provides the ESOL Ambassadors training for new members of the team.


