#### Geographic Distribution







## Instructional Models

#### **Sheltered/Self-Contained**

ELLs receive classroom instruction together

Teacher(s) adjust instruction and use ESOL strategies to make content comprehensible

#### **Mainstream/Inclusion**


Students in classroom with non-ELLs

Teacher(s) use ESOL instructional strategies to make content comprehensible

ELLs in the same grade may be assigned to the same classroom teacher(s)

#### **Dual Language**

Prepares students to become **fully bilingual** by learning listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in **English** and the **target language** (49 Schools)





## Accommodations

ELLs receive accommodations during statewide assessments AND daily instruction

Flexible Scheduling/
Additional Time

Assistance in Heritage Language

Bilingual Dictionary/
Glossary

An approved glossary is defined as word-to-word and may include content specific vocabulary

## ELL Committee Meetings

### Main purpose

Address the instructional program of an ELL and monitor progress

Meetings are scheduled when an ELL is entering his 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> year in the program

Parents must <u>always</u> be invited to attend

Parents may request a meeting





## Functions of the ELL Committee

#### **Function**

- Make instructional decisions for an ELL
- May make program placement recommendations

## Members Minimum of 3 School Personnel

- Administrator or designee
- ESOL teacher
- Home language teacher (if applicable)
- Classroom/subject area teacher(s)
- School counselors, school social workers, school psychologists
- Other educators as appropriate
- Parents must always be invited to attend

## Monitoring

- Students are monitored for two years after exiting the ESOL program
- During the two year period, if the parent or teacher has evidence that the student is having difficulty due to language acquisition, an ELL committee is convened
- ELL Committee members determines if the student should reenter the ESOL program



## Services Provided

- Inform parents and families about American and Broward County

- Provide assistance to ELLs and parents with school-related issues
  - Meet with families one-on-one

## Parent Tips – Homework Support Strategies

- Set a routine from the beginning
- Make homework time tech-free time
- Communicate homework is not an option
- Encourage and plan together
- Offer help only if needed
- Set a consequence if homework is complete/ incomplete and follow through
- Take pride in work submitted






## Parent Tips – Facilitate your child's success

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast
- Be sure they arrive at school on time
- Contact the school if absent or tardy
- Contact your child's teacher when you have questions or to get a progress report
- Explain the importance of focusing and listening
- Let them know it is okay to make mistakes
- Make time for play and to talk with your child
