Kindergarten October is here! We are in the full swing in Kindergarten. We are working on letter sounds and applying them to reading and writing, learning parts of a book and beginning writing stages. In math, we are comparing numbers 1 to 10. And in science, we are learning about living things and the plant life cycle. We will also be learning about the change in seasons now that it is officially fall! It is fire safety month so we will be doing activities that align with this and learning about fire safety! Your child's teacher will be conferencing with parents to update you on their progress thus far. So keep a look out for conference requests coming home in your child's folder or on the class app. Just a reminder to check your child's daily folder every day and read each night!

Wow, we are already halfway into the first quarter! First graders have been VERY busy. We have learned about having peace in our community and keeping a positive learning environment. *We completed the first 3 math topics with addition and subtraction. Next, in topic 4 the students will be able to subtract with facts to 20. *In science, the students have learned about science tools, their five senses, and the scientific method. The students will be learning about plants and how they grow in October! We will be going to Flamingo Gardens (October 17th) to explore different kinds of plants! Lastly, we will be using our science skills to examine apples, pumpkins, and even make a pizza garden! YUM!! *Writing time has been great fun as we began our unit on Narrative writing. The children are learning how to write a "small moment" writing piece, by writing step by step and with lots of detail. Ask your child about George McClement's book, Night of the Veggie Monster. They loved it! *Check out the homework journals daily for homework and the blue folder for important information. *Please be sure to read with your child nightly and have him/her share the reading strategies they are learning in class. Reading practice is the key to success! Thanks for all YOU do!

Second Grade Happy Fall Second Grade Families! The first quarter is coming to an end on October 11th. Monday, October 14th will be a Teacher Planning Day. All beginning of the year assessments has been completed and this information will be shared with you at parent conferences. Please make sure you are getting communication from your child's teacher through their classroom app. Communication between school and home is extremely important. In reading, the students will build literacy and language skills by participating in ten cross-disciplinary units of study in our Benchmark Advance Program. Each three-week unit will focus on one topic. The topics will range from economics to earth science, history and culture to themes in literature, and much more. Unit 1 was "Plants and Animals in Their Habitats". We are currently in Unit 2 "How Characters Face Challenges". In math, we are finishing Topic 3: Add with Sums to 100. There are online resources for families to support math instruction: https://bit.ly/3PsQiGB. You can use this resource all year long. Scroll down to find all the topics. There are videos and examples that you can use to help your child with math concepts. This valuable resource shows how concepts are taught through the Envision Math curriculum. In Science, we are continuing to work on Matter and will be moving on to Uses of Energy next. In Social Studies, we are learning about "Places Near and Far". Students are learning about Continents and Oceans, Countries in North America, and Where We Live. Our next Unit is on Historical Inquiry and Analysis. Some other wonderful things happening is Hispanic Heritage Month and later in October will be Red Ribbon Week. Look out for further details coming up! Our first field trip to Butterfly World in on October 16th. All online payments are due by October 6th. Please make time to read with your child each night, this is so important. Thank you for all you do at home to ensure your child's success. Please reach out to your child's teacher if you have any questions.

Our third graders have settled into their new routines and by now Third Grade have been exposed to all three specials including MEDIA every week! Please make sure to keep track of your child's day for MEDIA with their teacher, so as you know when to have them bring back their library books to exchange. By now, third-graders will have taken the first Benchmark Unit Test in their classrooms and will also soon be taking the first cumulative Math test on Topics 1-3. Classes are currently working on the Distributive property of Multiplication and have been or will be tackling strategies for multiplication tables between 0 and 12. Students will benefit greatly from a few minutes of daily facts practice with flashcards and/or making lists. The better they know the facts or at least how to figure them out quickly, the less challenging the problem-solving component will be. "Practice makes Progress!" In ELA, we are going to be diving into Character Development, Plot and Theme, Opinion Writing, Verb Tenses, Conjunctions and Compound words. In Science, we are engaging in Classifying Plants, and will next delve into Plant Structures and Functions. In Social Studies, students will be exposed to elements and figures of Hispanic Heritage, as we our study of levels of Government.

Here comes fall! Students have been adjusting well to the curriculum and to 4th grade expectations. In reading, we've read wonderful picture books like, "The Name Jar" and "Enemy Pie" to talk about character traits. In small reading group, we've been working on reading comprehension strategies and targeting summarizing and theme. In math, we are working on mastering multiplication facts and using basic facts to help us solve problems with bigger numbers. In social studies, we've been learning about geography. In science, we are learning about traits and animal adaptations. In language arts, we are working on converting singular nouns to plural nouns. All the beginning of the year testing is done, so your child's teacher will be reaching out soon to set up a conference. That's all for now! Happy Hispanic Heritage month!

Fifth Grade

Wow, how this year is flying by! I cannot believe we are already approaching the end of the first quarter! In Reading we are working on various literary texts focusing specifically on characterization, how story elements contribute to a plot and summarizing plot and theme. In Math we just completed Topic 3, Multiplying Multi-Digit Whole Numbers and now we are moving into Topic 4, Understand Multiplication with Decimals. In science all students have completed a hands-on scientific experiment utilizing the Scientific Process. We have now begun to explore properties of matter along with mixtures and solutions in Science. In Social Studies we are beginning to learn about early civilizations. Please save the date for our upcoming Science Night on November 13th. Also, be on the lookout for information regarding an upcoming field trip.

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
