▶ Happy New Year!!!! As we start the second half of the school year, we will hit the ground Kindergarten READING!!! Make sure you are reading with your child every day. We will continue to work on CVC words and blending letter sounds. Make sure you are reviewing sight words daily. The more fluent your child is with their sight words the more confident of reader they will become. We will continue working on addition and then subtraction in math. You can practice addition facts by playing fun games at home to keep it fresh. Continue to read daily with your child and talk about what you are reading to check for understanding. Thank you for continued teamwork in your child's education!

ightarrow It's hard to believe we are half way through the school year! We hope everyone had a nic ${\sf e}$ First Grade winter break! As we begin the third quarter, we are focusing on a few new things. To begin with, in Reading we are busy practicing reading strategies so that all the first graders continue to make progress. Our focus has been checking for understanding, retelling the story using details, using text features, cross-checking, as well as practicing sight words. These strategies are super important for comprehension and fluency! We will be continuing discussing who is telling the story. In Math, we are continuing learning about counting by 1s, 5s, and 10s. Please practice these skills at home, so the students can gain it! As we settle back in from the break, we plan to discuss magnifiers and materials found on earths surface. As always, please continue to read nightly, practice spelling and sight words, and having conversations with your child about what they are learning!

Second Grade

Welcome back second graders and Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful and restful Winter Break. This month we are going to be working with soil, adding and subtracting two-digit numbers, and continuing with Benchmark unit 4. Our field trip with the

G.A.B.I.E Science Bus will be on February 2nd. Please make sure to make the online payment before the deadline ends on January 28th. The payment is under Mrs. Gutzmer's name. Please continue to work with your child on I-Ready to conquer their 45 minute goal per week on both subjects. Thank you for your continued support!

Third Grade

HAPPY NEW YEAR!! 2024 is going to be EPIC! This is the year your third grader should become a fourth grader! We had lots of fun activities and themes during the last week before winter break, but it's time to dig deep! In the first week of January, third graders are starting Bench-

mark Unit 5 in their classrooms with a focus on the Advancement in Technology and on the essential question "What is the value in innovation?" In Reading, Language, and Grammar, we will be concentrating on compound sentences, context clues, and text structures, as well as continuing to identify and repair fragments and run-ons. In Writing, students will revisit Opinion writing citing evidence. We will also work on understanding of author's purpose and author claim. Teachers will also start doing additional BAS testing as needed for some students. Toward the end of the month, we will be concentrating on conjunctions, real-world perspectives, other types of poetry, and evidencebased inferences. We will also take the second I-Ready Diagnostic assessment. In Math, we will begin Topic 5, on Geometry, especially using Area and Perimeter. Students have taken the test for Topic 7: Adding Multi-digit whole Numbers before break. Teachers have also begun doing daily math review activities to keep students fresh on all Math concepts. At the end of each week, students may be getting a brief quiz on those particular items as a way of monitoring key standards. In Social Studies, we will be concentrating on the values and history around Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the impact his messages have had on society. This will also bring us into deeper studies on Black History. In Science we will venture into forms of Energy, including light, chemical, mechanical, heat, electrical, sound, and thermal, to name a few. As always, please make time for reading at home! This can include reading to your child, having your child read aloud to you or a sibling, or just reading silently. A great trick is to turn on the Closed Captioning on all your TVs. It is nearly impossible NOT to read words that come across the screen! This is NOT to replace reading books, or other literature, just a great practice tool!

Happy New Year!! We hope everyone had a wonderful winter break!! We are back and Fourth Grade ready to continue our mastery of 4th grade standards. This month we will begin our study of fractions in math. In Reading we will be focusing on text structures and author's perspective.

In science we will finish up life cycles and begin study of rocks and minerals.

Fifth Grade

Happy New Year! In reading, we are working on non-fiction texts again. We are focusing on the four text structures: compare and contrast, cause and effect, sequence, and problem and solution. We are also working on central idea, and first and secondhand accounts. In

grammar, we are working on verb tenses and appositives. In math, we are dividing fractions and will be moving coordinate planes and patterns. In science, we are working on forms of energy. In social studies, we are finishing up our Native American Projects and will be moving to Explorers.


