February 12, 2021 was designated as A Day of Service and Love in commemoration of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School tragedy three years ago. It was a day for us to give back to the community in honor of the 17 lives lost and those who were injured as well to recognize the recovery and strength of our students, staff and families who were impacted districtwide. Throughout the day students, teachers and staff engaged in activities and volunteer service projects to serve others within our school and community, while also raising awareness about important and meaningful causes and issues. These activities were developed by our very own teachers and staff.

In classes students wrote letters to support our active military, veteran personnel and first responders, and wrote messages of love. Students also participated in a school beautification project by painting rocks of kindness and love, made windmills for peace and revitalized the Hobin garden with orchids. The school counseling department was on hand to meet with students, provide support and have one on one discussions. The math department wrote "Messages of Hope" on colorful cutouts of butterflies that will be in the hallways of the 3400 building. Social Studies provided the Hobin garden with additional orchids while Science students painted the rocks of kindness. Team Literacy focused on positive messages through writing "What We Put in Writing: Our Words Matter". Fine Arts Department contributed the Pinwheels for Peace while JROTC created ribbons for teachers and staff to wear for the week. The CTE department worked on "The Wishing Garden" project and PE hosted "Hoops for Good Wishes and Thoughts". The World Language Department created "supporting hands" where the students cut out a hand and decorated it with words of support and encouragement. The ESE Department had students make "thank you for your service" cards and posters. They also provided lunch to Cooper City first responders. It was a beautiful week of Service and Love.

Our entire District observed a moment of silence on February 12th at 10:17 AM, to honor the Parkland community. It was a beautiful day of service and love and one that will always be remembered.


PARENT UNIVERSITY: TESTING, TESTING 1, 2, 3







MARCH IS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH



Women's History Month had its origins as a national celebration in 1981 when Congress passed Pub. L. 97-28 which authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982 as "Women's History Week." Throughout the next five years, Congress continued to pass joint resolutions designating a week in March as "Women's History Week." In 1987 after being petitioned by the National Women's History Project, Congress passed Pub. L. 100-9 which designated the month of March 1987 as "Women's History Month." Between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month. Since 1995, presidents have issued a series of annual proclamations designating the month of March as "Women's History Month." These proclamations celebrate the contributions women have made to the United States and recognize the specific achievements women have made over the course of American history in a variety of fields.







NEW WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATIONS



Broward County Public Schools is pleased to announce that as of Monday, November 23, 2020 all schools have water bottle filling stations available for student and staff use.

Each school location has a minimum of three bottle filling locations. Additional stations will be added to some schools as additional students return for face-to-face instruction.

Following the Thanksgiving holiday, schools will no longer provide bottled water and all students will need to bring a reusable water bottle to school each day.

Additional information about the procedures for these new bottle filling stations is included below.

FAQ's for Face **Covering Violations**

· Is a face covering required?

Yes. Policy 2170-E: Face Coverings requires that a facial covering/mask must be worn while on school campus, at a school-sponsored event, and while on school transportation.

· Can a student be issued a disciplinary violation from the Code of Student Conduct for not wearing a face covering?

Students may be issued disciplinary consequences for actions determined to be intentional, insubordinate, defiant and not accidental or incidental, or when redirection and interventions have been disregarded.

· What should I do if a student refuses to wear or keep on his/her face covering?

Provide reminders and redirection in alignment to the school and/or classroom behavior plan. If the student does not comply with the redirection from staff and the action is deemed to be a repeated disregard to the redirection, a disciplinary referral may be written

• What happens if the student refuses to wear or keep on the face covering while on school transportation?

Bus drivers may submit a disciplinary referral to the school administrator for a Level Two violation if a student does not comply with the reminder and/or redirection.

- Factors such as age, grade level, social-emotional, developmental and intellectual levels, ability and/or disability, and overall student rights and responsibilities will be considered.
- Students with disabilities who are eligible under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), have additional rights under IDEA or Section 504 and State Board Rule
