Tips From Our Math Coach, Mrs. Aversa!

Stay positive about math: Show enthusiasm and let your child know that math can be fun and enjoyable.

Emphasize growth: Encourage your child by reminding them that everyone can learn math with practice and perseverance.

Highlight the value of math: Help them see the importance of math in everyday life and different careers by sharing examples of how family members use math at work.

Model confidence: Avoid negative statements like "I was never good at math."

Instead, express confidence in your abilities to reinforce a positive mindset. **Promote persistence:** Teach your child that it's okay to struggle with difficult problems and encourage them to keep trying until they succeed.

Celebrate efforts and successes: Praise their hard work and join in their excitement when they solve problems or understand something new.
