- c. Advance placement Cambridge Presentation (Gelman Natale) Acceleration consists of 100 points of our school grade. We can get points when a student passes the class AND passes the overall exam for a CTE course, AICE course, AP course, or Dual Enrollment course. We can only gain 1 point per student during their entire time with us at JPT and we gain that one point their senior year. It doesn't apply to our school grade 2 years after as the

information lags. Currently, we are at 46 Acceleration points without the addition of any tests/courses passed this year. To reach more students we brought in 2 Dual Enrollment classes that do not require the entrance exams-SLS and the Science of Happiness as well as a Game Simulation and Design class for CTE. If you stick with a CTE program for 3 years and satisfy additional requirements students can earn the Bright Futures Gold Seal Vocational Scholars, but your degree has to be vocational related. Our students participating in Dual Enrollment has decreased from 575 in 2020 to 234 in 2023; we think because of poor promotion of the program. The pass rate for these classes are in the 80-90%s. One important thing to mention is that the grades earned in these courses WILL be part of their college transcripts. If students earn passing scores in 7 classes/tests in AICE courses and earn 100 service hours so students can automatically earn the 100% in Bright Futures. Even if students do not earn the AICE diploma they can still earn 3 college credit hours for course/test they pass.
