- III. School Advisory Council (SAC) and School Advisory Forum (SAF) Membership Voting/SAF Monthly Update
  - a. MacArthur Highschool monthly meeting updates
  - b. Due to the Stoneman Douglas tragedy, there has been a new bill created and in place for schools to identify threats. There is a school and district threat management team. Law enforcement, school personnel and district. (no parents on this team) Threats are determined as low, medium and high. ESE is not exempt from this process, but they will factor in their disability.
  - c. Focus will replace Edplan- next year
  - d. November 7 will be the vote to adopt the new bill listed above.
  - e. Reproductive Health survey was sent out to parents. The state needs to approve it.
  - f. If it is approved teachers will get training.
  - g. Parents can opt out.
  - h. They clarified gender and identity will not be part of the instruction
  - i. School to Prison Pipeline was discussed, to change the name of the school.
  - j. District Advisory looking to improve the school library. Ms. Chavez is taking suggestions.

- V. School Advisory Forum (SAF) Bylaws Approval
  - a. SAF has no changes
- VI. Approval of May 16, 2023- Minutes
  - a. Motioned by Ms. Wichmann, Second by Ms. Chacin
- VII. Student Achievement on State Assessments
  - a. Based on the FAST assessment we started at 27% and ended at 61%
  - b. This year we started at 39% so the scores are promising.
  - c. In Math, the numbers are low. This year 15% of our students are proficient but the math is at grade level and what you need to know by the end of the year. Last year we started at 12% and ended at 65%.
  - d. Parents look for growth. Not all kids can be 3,4,or 5 but they can all show learning gains.
  - e. Ms. LaFortune asked where parents can see the scores. Dr. Rodriguez stated you can see the scores on Virtual Counselor.
- VIII. Title I Information
  - a. Based on Free and Reduce Lunch
  - b. Parents still need to apply for lunch

- c. Title I provides additional resources for the school
  - d. School climate survey will be going out within a few months. 10% of the population must be completed.
  - e. A discussion was brought up on how to promote the survey. Ms. Camino suggested a QR code or a parent link. Parents preferred Parent link with the link. Ms. Camino will send it that way.
- IX. School Improvement Plan Goals
- a. Goal 1 was discussed – 60% increase in learning gains for SWD students for both Math and ELA. Dr. Rodriguez mentioned this is an area the school has struggled with.
  - b. Goal 2 – Attendance – the school will achieve reducing the number of students absent more than 10% of the school year by 10%

- a. As of September 5, 2023 the district report did not have any SESIR events.

- a. Budget- left over from last year \$8,414,07
  - b. Accelerated Reader- \$4,419.45 (427 licenses)
    - i. We will be voting next month.
    - ii. Ms. LaFortune asked if it is subscribed, will tests be implemented into the school schedule. Dr. Rodriguez agreed they should be given time. They will be given time to take the tests. He mentioned students start walking into the classroom at 7:50 so that time can be used for testing and centers can be added for testing.
    - iii. A parent mentioned there will be people who would want to do it at home. Dr. Rodriguez mentioned he would look into it because it is a test. Ms. Sanchez mentioned parents can inform the teacher that the student has to do an AR test.
