Expanding STEM and Computer Science Learning Opportunities

BCPS is a national leader in offering innovative and engaging STEM and Computer Science learning opportunities. Below are new initiatives from the Applied Learning Department.

- The District is excited to be awarded the College Football Playoffs Foundation Grant to bring mixed reality learning to more District schools.**
 The grant supports virtual and augmented reality learning by providing Meta Quest headsets to 10 schools over five years, with the first school being Millenium 6-12 Collegiate Academy. The high-tech headsets allow students to increase their math, science, and Career and Tech skills via a fun, unique, virtual environment. As part of the grant, each of the selected schools will also receive a media center refresh.
- STEM Learning Expands with Drones**
 Learning to design, build, code and fly drones continues to be popular among middle and high school students, and beginning this school year, elementary students are joining the high-flying action! Drone programs are now expanding to elementary schools with funding for coaches, professional development, equipment and student competitions.
- It's Game On for Elementary Esports**
 The District is proud to announce the popular Esports program is expanding to elementary schools. The elementary-level competitions will use Minecraft to support STEM learning while the competitions foster team building and leadership skills.

Preparing Students for Their Futures

The Career, Technical, Adult and Community Education (CTACE) Department is launching a new industry certification option this year. The Ducks Unlimited Ecology & Conservation Management Certification is available through Agriculture and Environmental Science courses. This certification provides students with hands-on experiences in responsible land and water use, and conservation methods to prepare students for future environmental science and agriculture careers.

Middle Schools Turn Up the Culinary Heat!

Eight BCPS middle schools are opening new culinary programs this year. The schools include Apollo Middle School, Attucks Middle School, Deerfield Beach Middle School, Lauderdale Lakes Middle School, Margate Middle School, Olsen Middle School, Pines Middle School and Silver Lakes Middle School. Through the culinary program, students earn the *Food Safety and Science Certification*, which signifies an in-depth knowledge of food safety procedures and standards.

In addition, CTACE is working with middle schools and centers with existing culinary programs to revamp and update their kitchens to provide students with top-of-the-line culinary experiences!
